Closer than you think

Centrally located and with excellent rail and road links Worcester is easily reached from the rest of the UK and the world. You can drive to Worcester in just 60 minutes from Bristol, Coventry or Telford; 45 minutes from Birmingham; 45 minutes from Hereford or Wolverhampton; or 90 minutes from Cardiff.
